❑❑ The Pixel is a boat for the new century. It is stable, roomy, fast and self-bailing — a giant step into the future of small boat design. It was designed as a junior trainer but has the legroom and capacity for adult enjoyment as well.

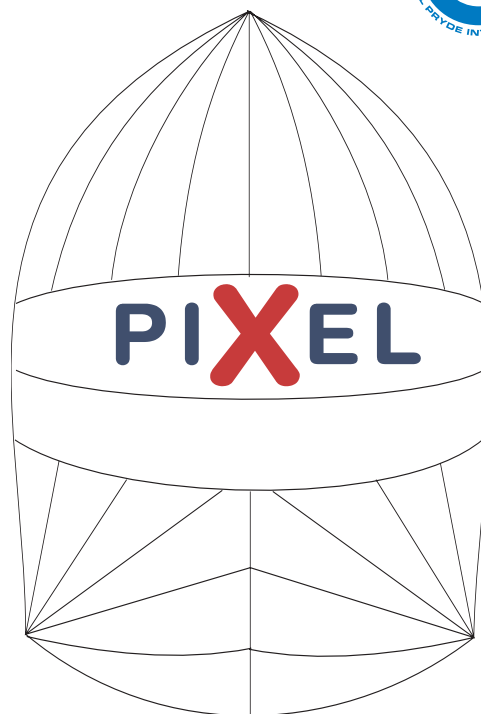
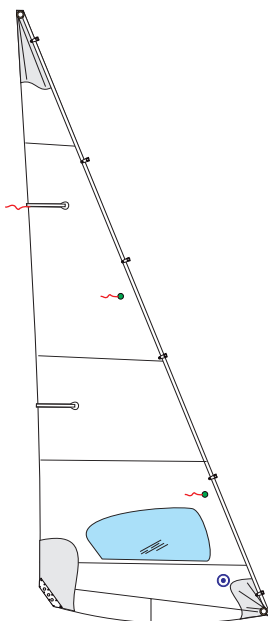
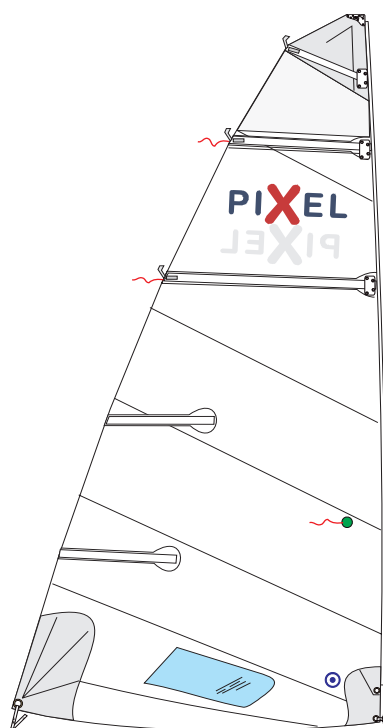
The 13'9" sloop was designed by Bruce Kirby, who also designed the Laser, a series of highly successful International 14s, the Sonar and Ideal 18. The designer's experience racing 14s, Finns and Lasers at Olympic and World level made him a natural choice to design this up-to-the-minute dinghy.

The result of this pedigree is a handsome little boat that provides a feeling of security with superior performance for a crew of 2 or 3.

Here's what *Sailing World* has to say: "The Pixel is a light, stable transition dinghy for youth sailors learning about jibs and symmetrical spinnakers. The double bottom and shape of the side tanks make lounging on the floor comfortable, which for rec sailors is a plus."

And *Soundings* says: "The Pixel accelerates well in puffs, moves nicely through the chop and will plane easily, with or without spinnaker, in a modest breeze. The open transom makes the Pixel easy to self rescue after a capsize."

There is a larger market for this boat, but the focus for the moment is on optimist sailors moving up to a two or three person boat that is exciting but not threatening.
